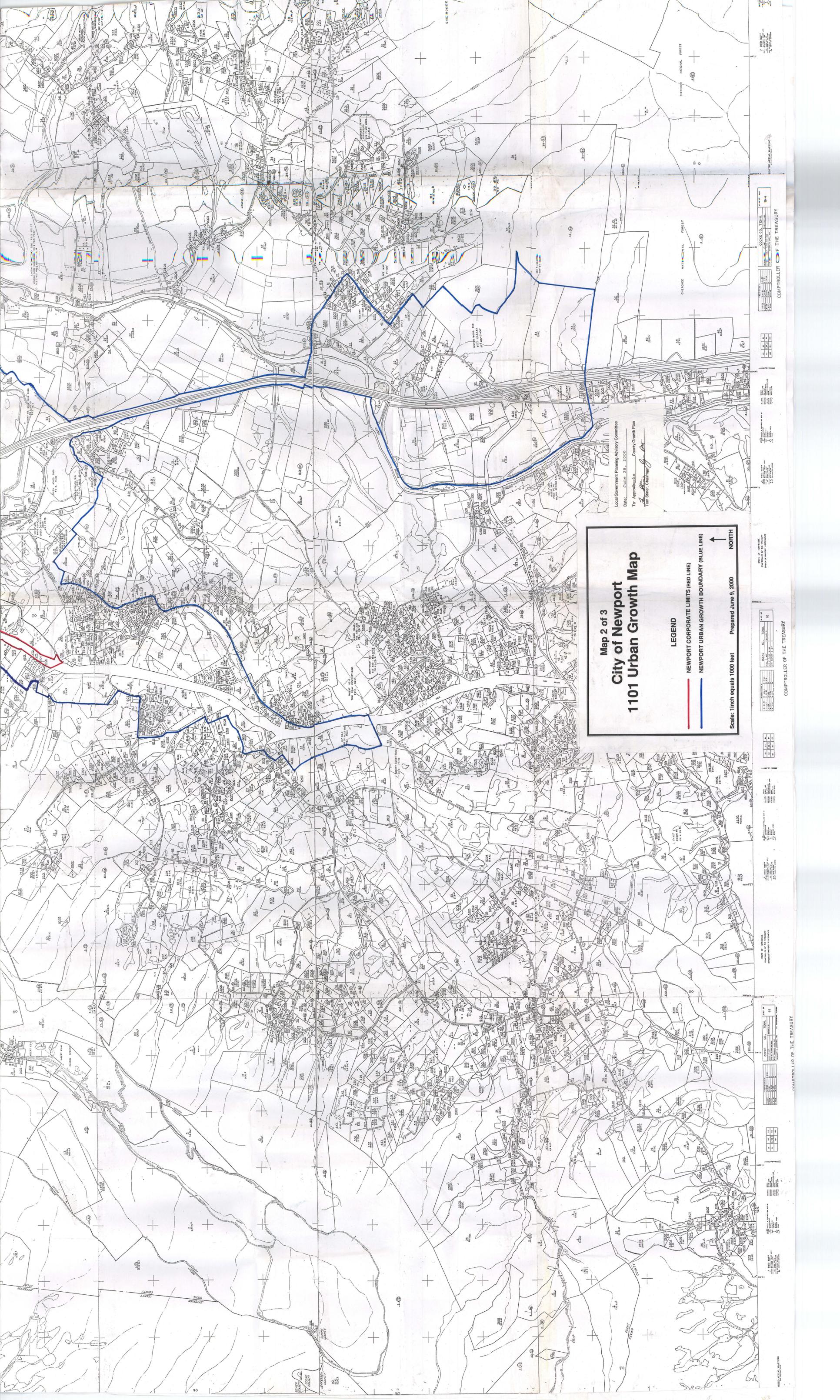

WHEREAS, developers of the proposed new exit 438 on I-40 and developers of the commercial property behind Lowe's have requested the extension of urban services from the Town of Newport, and,

2. Second public hearing held on the 7th day of August, 2008 with notice thereof published in the Newport Plain Talk on July 23, 2008.

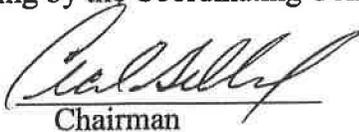

Mayor Hommel called the Meeting to order at 6:10 P.M.

The Minutes of the Meeting held Thursday, July 3, 2008 were read by Debbie Hommel and were approved with a motion by Commissioner Brown and seconded by Commissioner Reed. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Crosswalks discussed

Wayne Jones stated that the Department of Transportation has called him about speeders and he was told that a deputy needs to stop speeders. Also, Jones said the State will work with the Town of Parrottsville to get a needed crosswalk with a stop and go light. Jones added that if Mike Callahan with C&E Designers still wants him to write a letter that he will do so, that other handicapped people could use the crosswalk and stop and go light.

2. Green Way Trail

Mayor Hommel said that Mike Callahan with C&E Designers has not let him know anything about the Green Way Trail.

3. Gilbert Street name still questioned

Attorney Davidson said that he has gone to the 911 office in Newport and asked why the name change from Balch Farm Way to Gilbert Street and he was told that Keith Keller said the Board of Commissioners wanted it changed considering the fact the Commissioners did not know anything about the name change; Commissioner Brown said the commissioners name used was unlawful. Commissioner Brown stated that trailer park residents do not know when meetings are held, that they feel neglected.

4. Announcements of Town Meetings

Mayor Hommel said that he has called MTAS and the meetings really do not have to be placed in the newspaper. Mayor Hommel said that a schedule of council meetings could be placed in the sewer bills each month. Commissioner Brown expressed the need for

more council members and Tim Kearns suggested meetings be posted under the plexiglass box at the park.

5. Grant postponed

Mayor Hommel stated the grant for the Ted Winter Recreation Park has been postponed by the Governor due to lack of funds.

6. Post office building

Mayor Hommel said there is no news about the purchase of the old post office building, that Attorney Davidson has modified the contract for the purchase of the building, then the contract needs to be signed and then taken to the Parrottsville United Methodist Church for approval.

7. Maintenance report

Tim Kearns gave his report for the month of July.

New Business

1. Urban Growth Plan for Newport

Mayor Hommel said that we need to approve the Urban Growth Plan for the Economic Development Commissioner for the Town of Newport. This should be approved by the Town of Parrottsville. Commissioner Brown asked why should the Town of Parrottsville be involved with this since they do not attend our meetings and we do not attend theirs. Thad Balch said that it is just a technicality, that we should do it because it really doesn't affect us and we would hate to keep them from getting the Urban Growth Plan approved. Commissioner Brown asked if Keep Cocke County Beautiful belongs and if there will be a cost. After discussion Commissioner Brown made a motion to approve Newport's Urban Growth Plan with a second by Commissioner Reed. Motion carried.

2. Heritage Days

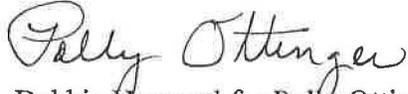

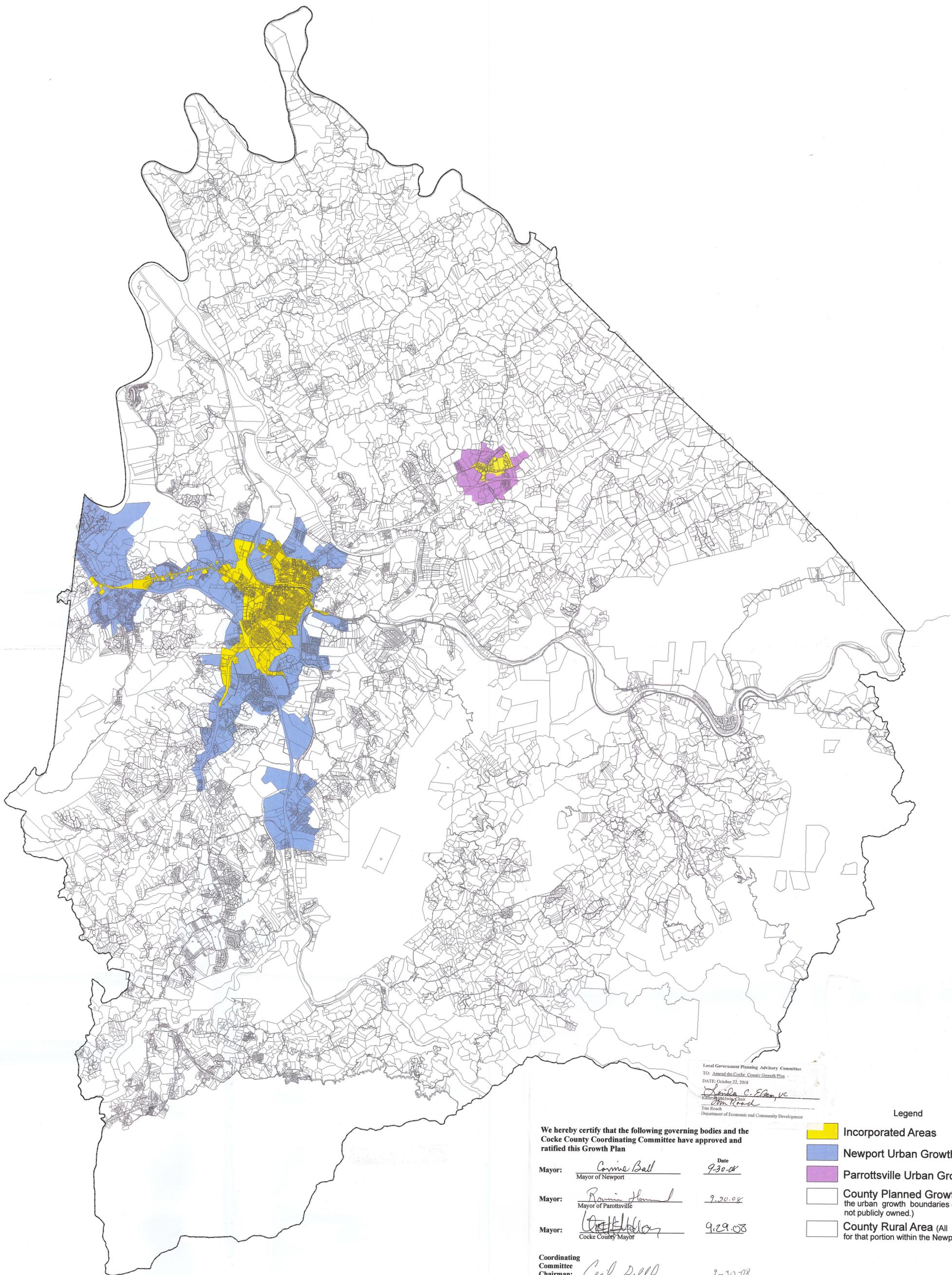
